





Project Understanding

The Lake Madrone Water District intends to conduct a sediment removal Project in Lake Madrone. The USACE and the District have requested an ARDR to be prepared. In support of potential permit actions by the USACE a National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) §106 compliant report may be required and is offered as an optional task. Tasks 1-7 are addressed under separate and previous proposals.

Task 8: Aquatic Resource Delineation Report

Gallaway Enterprises will conduct a Delineation of Aquatic Resources. within the clients selected boundary. The client-supplied boundary will be used as the extent of the survey area (approx. 2 acres). All waters of the U.S. that meet the Clean Water Act criteria and are regulated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) will be evaluated within the survey area.  of sub-surface components of prehistoric or historic-era sites, or recovery of any surface
 occurring artifacts.
- Prepare cultural resources inventory report per CEQA and NHPA Section 106.
- Transmittal of final inventory survey report to NEIC/client.
